2021/22 PRIORITIES: SHARPENING OUR FOCUS TO DELIVER IMPACT

To deliver on our APP 2021/22, we have committed to the following 4 priorities designed to deliver **game-changers** despite the challenging environment: These include:

- Expediting high-profile corruption cases nationally & provincially
- Focusing on serious violent & organised crime, as well as crimes that disproportionately undermine public safety
- Capacitating the organisation through recruiting crucial additional skills,
 expertise and capabilities, to respond to existing and emerging priorities
- Enhancing staff morale & well-being



THE ID IS A GAME CHANGER

- An effective ID will deliver concrete and impactful results in the fight against highlevel corruption that will assist in restoring investor confidence
- Significant progress has been made in capacitating the ID, despite the hugely complex environment
- National Treasury has given undertaking to locate cyber technology of the Zondo Commission in NPA
- Strengthened international cooperation starting to show results Michael Lomas
- Poised to make significant progress on priority matters



AFU GAME CHANGERS: BRINGING BACK THE MONEY

- The co-location of DPCI investigators in NPA regional offices
- POCA legislative amendments
- Strengthening and developing stakeholder relationships with SARB & FIC
- North West intervention
- Collaborating with ID to bring back stolen money from state capture cases through formal partnership agreement
- Prioritising corruption cases at different levels within the NPA
- Securing the required capacity for AFU, including forensic capability and project managers, aspirant advocates specialising in asset recovery and additional forensic investigators etc.
- Effective management of curators and related costs



OTHER SELECTED EXAMPLES OF GAME-CHANGERS

- Community prosecution initiative
- Housebreaking prioritised with partners as this affects the quality of life of South Africans
- Building a forensic capability for government, including the NPA
- Increased use of information technology and digitisation
- Innovation in recruiting, training and retaining the right staff
- Bold initiatives to ensure that we have a motivated and inspired workforce



OTHER SELECTED EXAMPLES OF GAME-CHANGERS (cont.)

- Reviewing the functioning of all Thuthuzela Care Centres in order to ensure efficiency and capacitation - a uniform approach will be established across and a joint stakeholder training manual developed
- Revitalising process in respect of the National and Provincial TCC coordinating structures is underway

CONCLUSION: FROM STRATEGY TO ACTION

- NPA on the path to becoming an inspired, properly capacitated and modernised prosecution service able to deal with 21st century crime and criminal justice matters
- But hard work still lies ahead, and we need to match funding to demand and expectations. Our budget increase is only 2% which is well below inflation. More funding will be required.
- DPCI will also need to be capacitated to meet the increase in NPA capacity, and growing complexity of SA's crime problem
- NPA remains committed to delivering through increased innovation,
 transformation and ethical engagement at all levels
